



**W**HEREAS *The Rev. Alexander Waugh of Allso's Buildings, in the Parish of Saint Mary Le Bone in the County of Middlesex Defendant, Minister on the twenty eighth day of March 1792* being then aged *thirty seven years the sixteenth day of August 1791*. Did become a Member of the Voluntary Society called the LONDON ANNUITY SOCIETY, on the Terms and Conditions of a certain Deed of Agreement made for the Establishing and Government of the said Society, dated the first Day of January, 1765. AND WHEREAS the said *Alexander Waugh* hath executed the said Deed, and paid the appointed Premium to the Treasurer of the said Society, and hath agreed to make the annual Payment of *Five Guineas* and also all other Payments appointed by the said Deed, and subsequent By-Rules, during the Term of his natural Life. Now this Instrument, or Policy of Assurance, WITNESSETH, That in Consideration of the Premises: We three of the Trustees of the said Society for the Time being, Do hereby charge, subject, and make liable the capital Stock, Fund, Estate, and Effects of the said Society, with and to the Payment of such an Annuity, or yearly Sum of Money, to *Mary late, Wife of the said Alexander Waugh* now the Wife of the said *Alexander Waugh* during so long as she shall be and continue the Widow of the said *Alexander Waugh* as she by the Terms and Conditions of the said Deed, and subsequent By-Laws, shall upon her said Husband's Death become entitled unto, in respect of his said annual Payment of *Five Guineas* and the Time of his being a Member of the said Society, such Annuity to be paid to her by two equal half yearly Payments, the first Payment to become due, and be made on the Second of the four general Quarter Days of the Year which shall first happen after the Decease of her said Husband, in case he shall have lived one whole Calendar Year from the said *twenty eighth* Day of *March 1792*. AND we do hereby order, appoint, authorize, and empower the Directors of the said Society, for the Time being, to raise and pay such Annuity or yearly Sum of Money, from Time to Time accordingly, to the said *Mary Waugh* by and out of the Monies, Securities, and Effects of the said Society, according to the Terms of the said Deed, and subsequent By-Rules: PROVIDED always, and this Policy is upon these Conditions, That if this Policy hath been obtained by false Pretences, or if the said *Alexander Waugh* shall not duly pay the said annual Sum of *Five Guineas* and the other Payments appointed to be made by him in respect thereof, during the Term of his natural Life, or shall in any Manner incur a Forfeiture of this Policy, by the Breach or non-Performance of any of the Articles contained in the Deed of Settlement, or subsequent By-Rules, or in case the said *Mary Waugh* shall marry again, or shall not observe and keep the Rules and Orders of the said Society, or demean herself agreeable to the Terms of the said Deed, or subsequent By-Rules; or if any Assignment shall be made of this Policy, or of the Annuity hereby secured, then and in every such Case this Policy shall cease and become void to all Intents and Purposes. IN WITNESS whereof we three of the Trustees of the said Society have hereunto set our Hands and Seals, the *twenty ninth* Day of *August* in the *thirtieth second* Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord *George the third* of Great-Britain, France and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c. And in the Year of our Lord 1792.

Note, This Policy will be also forfeited in these particular Cases.  
 By the Husband. On entering into the Land or Sea Service; or by going out of the Kingdom, or any coasting Voyage of twenty Leagues from Port to Port without Licence, if He dies abroad or on the Seas; or being killed by a Duel, or by committing Felony.  
 By the Wife. On being divorced for Adultery, being guilty of Felony, or by unlawful Cohabitation.  
 N. B. Every Widow, whose Husband died of the Small Pox must abate a fifth Part of her Annuity for Life.
