with any Disorder which tends to shorten Life; And Whereas the said James Stonehouse and Samuel Hoffman Nockells have paid at the Office of
the said Company the Sum of Fifteen Pounds ten Shillings as a Premium for One whole
Year commencing from the Date of this Policy.

Now know all Men by these Presents, That if the said Robert Sugden shall die at any Time within the Term of One Year
on the Twenty third Day of January 1825 both Days included; or if the said James Stonehouse and Samuel A. Nockells
their Executors Administrators or Assigns, shall in the event of the said Robert Sugden living beyond the said Term of One Year
pay at the Office of the said Company, during the Life of the said Robert Sugden
on or before the Twenty third day of January in every subsequent Year, the Funds and Property of the said Company shall be subject and
liable to pay and satisfy, within Three Calendar Months after satisfactory Proof shall have been received, at the Office of the said Company, of the Death of the said Robert Sugden, unto the said James Stonehouse and Samuel Hoffman Nockells their Executors Administrators or Assigns, the Sum of Four Hundred and ninety nine Pounds nineteen Shillings and six pence hereby assured. Provided always, That in case the said Robert Sugden shall die upon the high Seas, unless in passing direct from one part of the United Kingdom to another, or shall go beyond the Limits of Europe, or shall enter into, or engage in any Military, Naval, or Preventive Service, without previous Licence from the Court of Directors of the said Company for that Purpose, or if any thing stated by the said James Stonehouse and Samuel Hoffman Nockells either in the Declaration or Attestation hereinbefore mentioned to have been made by them shall not be true, this Policy shall be null and void, and the Monies paid by or in behalf of the said James Stonehouse and Samuel Hoffman Nockells, on account of this Insurance shall be forfeited. Provided always, and it is hereby expressly agreed and declared, and the true Intent and Meaning hereof is, that the Capital Stock and Funds of the said Company shall alone be answerable to the Demands thereupon under this Policy; and that no Member thereof shall be subject or liable to any Demands against the said Company, upon any account or Pretence whatsoever, beyond his or her Share of the Capital Stock or Funds of the said Company, and which Share is set opposite his or her Signature to the Deed of Settlement, or mentioned in some other Instrument, declaring him or her to be a Member thereof, any thing contained in this Policy to the contrary thereof notwithstanding.
