and the consideration to be paid by the said Association, for the said sum of *One thousand One hundred and fifty* Pounds, as an Estimated, or Yearly Sum of *One hundred and fifty* Pounds, payable in the said *half* yearly Payments, to continue from the *fourth* day of *March* next, and to continue during the natural life of the said *James Holbrook*,

It is therefore the Condition of the above written Bond or Obligation in such that the above bounden *Thomas Stewart, William Edward Taylor, and James Percival Spettler*

now next ensuing, and which said Bond and Obligation is to remain in full force and virtue during the *Life* of the said *James Holbrook*

Provided always, and it is expressly agreed and declared, and the true intent and meaning of these presents are, that the Capital, Stock, and Funds of the said Association shall at all times be answerable to the demands under this Bond and Obligation.

Received the day of the date of the above written Obligation of and from the said *James Holbrook* the full and just Sum of *One thousand One hundred and fifty* Pounds being the consideration Money above mentioned to be paid by him, as Witness our hands
