**Whereas,** William George Foster of Penny Street Portsmouth, Corn and Coal Merchant

hath proposed to effect an Assurance with the NATIONAL ASSURANCE AND INVESTMENT ASSOCIATION, in the Sum of Three Hundred Pounds upon his own Life for the whole continuance thereof; and hath delivered at the Office of the said Association, a statement in writing signed by him the said William George Foster and bearing Date the 6<sup>th</sup> Day of December last, which Statement in writing or Declaration the said Assured hath agreed shall be the basis of the contract between himself and the said Association.

**And Whereas** the said Assured hath paid at the Office of the Association the Sum of Fourteen Pounds and Ten Shillings as a Premium for the said Assurance for the term of Twelve Calendar Months, to be computed from the Day of the Date of this Policy, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged.

**Now this Policy Witnesseth,** that if the said Assured shall die before the expiration of the said Term of Twelve Calendar Months, or shall live beyond such Term, and—he, or his—Assigns, shall at or before the expiration of that Term, and at or before the expiration of every succeeding Twelve Calendar Months, during the continuance of this Assurance, pay at the Office of the said Association, the Premium of Fourteen Pounds and Ten Shillings then the Funds and other Property of the Association shall be subject and liable, according to the provisions of the Deed or Deeds of Settlement of the said Association, to pay to the Executors, Administrators, or Assigns, of the said Assured, within Three Calendar Months after satisfactory proof of the Death of the said Assured shall have been received at the Office of the said Association, the Sum of Three Hundred Pounds of Lawful Money of Great Britain.


**Provided always,** and these Presents are upon this express condition, that in case any Statement or Allegation contained in the Declaration hereinbefore mentioned (which Declaration shall be considered part of this Policy, as if the same were actually repeated and set forth herein) be untrue, or if the Assurance hereby made shall have been made through any misrepresentation, concealment, or untrue averment whatsoever, or being or becoming a military or naval man, shall enter into actual service without the licence of the Board of Directors previously obtained, or shall commit suicide, or die by duelling, or the hands of justice, this Policy shall be void, and all monies paid in respect thereof shall be forfeited to the Association.

**Provided nevertheless,** that the Capital Stock and Funds of the said Association shall alone be liable to answer and make good all claims and demands whatsoever under or by virtue of this Policy, and that no Director or Proprietor of the Association shall be in any case personally liable or subject to any such claims or demands, nor be in anywise charged, by reason of this or any other Policy or Instrument of Assurance, beyond the amount of his or her Share or Shares of such Capital Stock or Funds, it being one of the Fundamental Principles of the Association that the responsibility of the Individual Members shall be in all cases limited to their respective Shares in the Capital Stock of the said Association.
