This Policy of Assurance Witnesseth, That *Thomas Mitchell* of *West Ashton in the County of Wiltshire* ^{Heaver} paid the Sum of *three Shillings and nine pence* to the **Wiltshire and Western Assurance Society**, and agreed to pay, or cause to be paid to the said Society at their Office in *Knowlbridge* the Sum of *three Shillings and nine pence* on the *twenty fourth* day of *June 1793* and the like Sum of *three Shillings and nine pence* yearly on the *twenty fourth* day of *June* during the Continuance of this Policy, for the Insurance from Loss or Damage by Fire, on *a Gensment and Ubeaving Shop adjoining silvats at West Ashton aforesaid* in his own Occupation *Brick Stone and Platch only Sixty pounds* on his household Goods and Looms therein only *fifteen pounds*

Now know all Men by these Presents, That from the Date hereof, and for so many years next ensuing as the said *Thomas Mitchell* his Heirs, Executors and Administrators, shall duly pay or cause to be paid to the said Society the yearly Sum of *three Shillings and nine pence* at the times aforesaid, and the Directors, or Governors and Trustees of the said Society for the time being, shall agree to accept the same, the Stock and Fund of the said Society, shall be subject and liable to pay to the said *Thomas Mitchell* his Executors, Administrators and Assigns, all such *his* Damage and Loss which *he* the said *Thomas Mitchell* his Heirs, Executors, Administrators or Assigns shall suffer by Fire, not exceeding the Sum of *Seventy five* Pounds, according to the exact Tenor of the Printed Proposals of the said Society, dated the 5th. day of July 1790. delivered herewith, and signed by three of the Directors and Trustees of the said Society.

In Witness whereof, we, three of the Directors and Trustees aforesaid, for the said Society, have hereunto set our Hands and Seals, the *twenty sixth* Day of *June* 1793.
