Dwelling house being the second story down stairs in the West entry of James's Court, and on the West side of the said stair, presently possest by the said John Johnston all stone and slated not exceeding Two hundred pounds sterling.

NOW KNOW YE, That, from the Date of these Presents, and so long as the said

Mr Isabella Woodhouse & John Johnston shall duly pay, or cause to be paid, the said sum of Four shillings at the Term

and Place aforesaid, and the DIRECTORS of said SOCIETY for the Time being shall agree to accept the same, The Stock of the said SOCIETY shall be subject and liable to pay to the said

Mr Isabella Woodhouse & John Johnston their Heirs, Executors, or Assignees,

All such their Damage and Loss, which they the said Mr Isabella Woodhouse & John Johnston shall suffer by Fire, not exceeding the sum of Two hundred

Pounds, according to the Tenor of the printed Proposals issued by said SOCIETY, bearing Date the 15th Day of May 1775. IN WITNESS WHEREOF, We (three of the ORDINARY

DIRECTORS of the said SOCIETY for the Time being) have subscribed these Presents, AT

EDINBURGH the Twentieth Day of October in the Year of our Lord
